Roadside vegetation projects funded

Roadside Vegetation Implementation Project (RVIP) grants will fund a total of 10 individual projects and two regional projects, involving 28 councils across NSW.

RVIP grants are funded by NSW Environmental Trust and administered by Local Government NSW. They support projects to remove environmental weeds, undertake bush regeneration, direct seeding, protect endangered species, improve signage of environmentally sensitive areas and train staff including council works crews.

New innovative projects for weeds 2013-2015

The <u>NSW Department of Primary Industries</u> has called for innovative projects addressing high priority weeds in NSW. The new funding builds on the current NSW <u>Weeds Action Program</u> (WAP), and addresses priorities in the NSW <u>Invasive Species Plan</u> (ISP). Projects will prevent and manage new weed incursions, contain existing weeds, build effective partnerships and/or address research, training, and education.

Society seminar: Using herbicides effectively in the future

Topics will cover permits, legislation at both federal and state levels, new herbicides and what's coming on-line, spray drift management and application strategies, and weed control and environmental weed risk management. Further details available soon from the Society website.

Invasive weeds and bushfires

The spread of invasive weeds such as buffel grass (*Cenchrus ciliaris*) in semi-arid Australia increases fuel loads and poses higher risks during bushfires. Fires in native vegetation areas are more patchy, helping preserve floral diversity. Controlling invasive weeds has high benefits in areas of high conservation value.
